Why do we need a neighbourhood plan?

What is a Neighbourhood Plan and why is it important

Neighbourhood plans are a brand new tool given to local communities by the Localism Act 2009 to set for themselves a future development of the parish to meets the aims and expectations of those who live and work here. It's important because it is your plan setting out your hopes and aspirations for the future of Flore within the national and district planning framework..

What steps have the parish council taken?

The Parish Council has undertaken the formal steps required to enable us to start the process. This is required by law and we hope to have the approval of Daventry District Council to our proposal by June, so that we can formally begin the process and start to get everyone involved.

A volunteer steering group of villagers with both a passion for Flore and a full range of skills has been set up by the Parish Council to help us in the development of our plan. The group comprises Tom Higginson (Chair), Heather and Andy Anderson, John Miller, Brian Thomas, Nigel Strang and Cllrs Sue Kerrison, Geoff Fellows and Paul Boans.

What's next?

We are planning a number of events as our aim is to reach right across the various groups, businesses, individuals and landowners to build up a picture (and evidence base) for the next stages in the development of the Flore Plan.
